Introduction

Following the success of the Falcon International 3 Day Professional Road Race held during September last year we this year have great pleasure in presenting an even better professional bicycle race.

From the 17th-21st April the Falcon 5 Day 6 Stage professional/ amateur road race will be held in the Humberside and Lincoln areas with 6 stages of varying terrain and interest for both competitors and spectators alike. The first stage being on a tough 16 mile road race circuit based on Barton on Humber, South Ferriby, Saxby All Saints, Worlaby. Stage 2 is on a sporting $6\frac{1}{4}$ mile circuit based at Waltham near Grimsby but this is only a short stage and will be followed by a very tough stage to be held at the Cadwell Park Motor Racing circuit of $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles and here 15 laps will be covered. The event at Cadwell is being held during an international kart meeting so there will be other interest at the Cadwell Park racing on Sunday afternoon. On Monday the fourth stage switches to Lincoln again a $6\frac{1}{2}$ mile circuit to be covered 13 times making a total distance of 84 miles of quite hard riding. New interest is the stage in Hull on the Tuesday evening. We have had help from the Hull Thursday Road Club and the Humberside Police in selecting an excellent 4.8 mile circuit in the Anlaby, Kirk Ella area. The final stage at Barton on a 2.8 mile undulating circuit which should prove a wonderful climax to the 5 days of racing.

This year the British Olympic team will compete with the British professionals.

Brian Mann of the Lindsey Roads Cycling Club is official race organiser. I would like personally to thank him and all the officials who are giving their valuable time to help with this promotion. Also thanks to the Humberside and Lincoln police who have been so helpful.

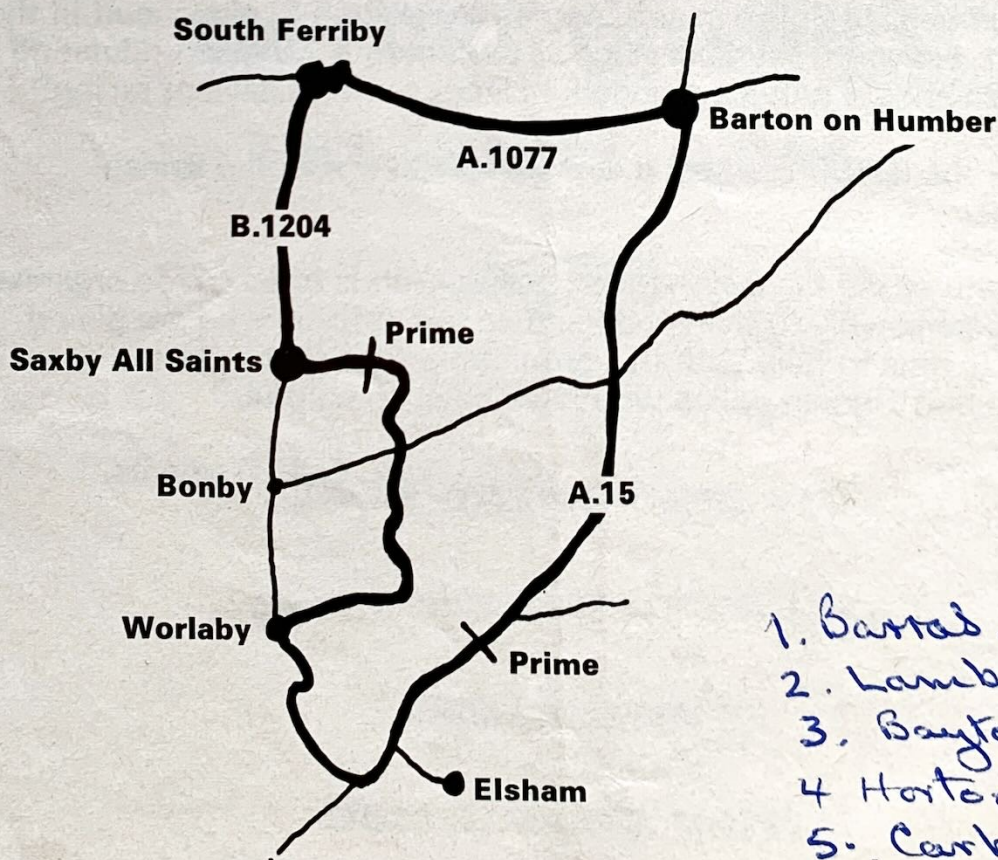

After 5 laps turn left onto A 1077, one mile west of Barton turn right onto unclass. road, 3rd right into Far Ings Road to FINISH 100 yards short of junction with Waterside Road.
